

Order of Service for March 14th Lenten Devotional
(room opens at 6:55- service starts at 7pm)

I. **Welcome and Open with a recorded Hymn**

II. **4th Sunday Scripture:**

The Son of Man must be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. John 3:14–15

III. **Light Candles: Say the prayer:**

Almighty and most merciful God, kindle within us the fire of love, that by its cleansing flame we may be purged of all our sins and made worthy to worship you in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

iV. **Invite Prayers:** *All those in attendance can add their own petitions at this time.*

For these and all our prayers, we ask your mercy.
Lord Jesus, stay with us, for evening is at hand and the day is past; be our companion in the way, kindle our hearts, and awaken hope, that we may know thee as thou art revealed in Scripture and community. Grant this for the sake of thy love. **Amen.**

V. **Canticles:** read by leaders breaking at the asterisk.

A Song of Penitence *Prayer of Manasseh 1-2, 4, 6-7, 11-15*

*O Lord and Ruler of the hosts of heaven, **
God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and of all their righteous offspring:
*You made the heavens and the earth, **
with all their vast array.
*All things quake with fear at your presence; **
they tremble because of your power.
*But your merciful promise is beyond all measure; **
it surpasses all that our minds can fathom.
*O Lord, you are full of compassion, **
long-suffering, and abounding in mercy.
*You hold back your hand; **
you do not punish as we deserve.
*In your great goodness, Lord, you have promised forgiveness to sinners, **
that they may repent of their sin and be saved.
*And now, O Lord, I bend the knee of my heart, **
and make my appeal, sure of your gracious goodness.
*I have sinned, O Lord, I have sinned, **

*and I know my wickedness only too well.
Therefore I make this prayer to you: *
 Forgive me, Lord, forgive me.
Do not let me perish in my sin, *
 nor condemn me to the depths of the earth.
For you, O Lord, are the God of those who repent, *
 and in me you will show forth your goodness.
Unworthy as I am, you will save me, in accordance with your great mercy, *
 and I will praise you without ceasing all the days of my life.
For all the powers of heaven sing your praises, *
 and yours is the glory to ages of ages. Amen.*

The Song of Zechariah Luke 1: 68-79

*Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; *
 he has come to his people and set them free.
He has raised up for us a mighty savior, *
 born of the house of his servant David.
Through his holy prophets he promised of old, that he would save us from our enemies, *
 from the hands of all who hate us.
He promised to show mercy to our fathers *
 and to remember his holy covenant.
This was the oath he swore to our father Abraham, *
 to set us free from the hands of our enemies,
Free to worship him without fear, *
 holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life.
