Schedule, Part 1:

February 24: Introduction: Let the Bible Teach You How to Read It

March 3: Origin Stories: Creation and "Fall", Cain's Murders of Abel, Tower of Babel Prereading: *Genesis* 1:1-4:16, 11:1-9

March 10: Biblical Genocide?: Joshua's Holy Wars and the Language of Violence Prereading: *Joshua* 1-13, 18:1-10, 20, 23-24; *Judges* 2:1-5

March 17: Desiring the Common Good: Sex and Gender Roles in Scripture

Prereading: Genesis 3:1-21, Judges 4 & 5 (Deborah and Jael), Leviticus 18, 19:29 (Sex rules), Romans 16:1-16 (look for women's names, including "Apostle Junia"), 1 Corinthians 5:1-8, 6:9–11, 7:1-6, 11:2-16 (a letter of Paul to a Greek congregation arguing among themselves about all this and Paul tries to help them find a path forward),

March 24: The End is Near: Much Misunderstood Apocalyptic Literature

Prereading: Daniel 7-8, Revelation

A second slate of passages will likely appear as Part II later this year and include the questionable morality of the patriarchs in Genesis, the love poetry of the Song of Songs, strange actions by prophets, and hard sayings of Jesus.
